Parental Resilience:

Summer Holidays are particularly challenging for parent carers. They have to forgo any time for themselves as they have to ensure that their children are being looked after and entertained. Parent carers are reporting difficulties in finding what to do with their children over the summer break, finding activities that they would be able to safely engage in. Parent carers are also reporting that this is placing extra financial pressures on their families as most activities are costly and their children often do not understand the financial implications and struggle to understand why they are to go on a holiday, etc.

Due to the difficulties that parent carers are experiencing, FVP has organised activities and trips for families. This helps us to provide peer-to-peer support, tackles isolation and loneliness as well as ensures that families are able to spend some quality time together without the pressures of organizing the activities.

Education/School Attendance:

In July 2023, FVP has conducted a SEND pupil school attendance and experience survey. The survey report has been published and although it is a reflection of the respondents and does not represent the whole of Peterborough's SEND population, the results show that 43% of children and young people are unable to access full time education and face part time timetables, exclusions, Alternative provisions etc.

The survey report have been presented to the Local Authority and due to worrying nature of the results, we have also produced a Topic of Importance, which means that the Local Authority will have to respond to the daily issues that parent carers, their children and young people are facing and work together to improve the current service provision.

Accessing Mental Health Services:

Accessing Mental Health services is still an issue for parent carers and their children/young people. They report that the waiting times are long, school's do not help them to combat the issues any by the time they finally get a referral to see a specialist and get some help for their children, the waiting times are often long. Whilst waiting for some help. Parents feel like they are in a limbo and do not know what to do in a mean time, struggle to keep their children safe from harm. Declining mental health often leads to school refusals which means that parent have to take some time off work to take care of their children. Parent carers often say that 'no one cares' about the issues they are facing and they don't know where top get the help they need.

Parent carers thanked us for our continuous support:

In order to help our parent carers over the school holidays, FVP has organised a few trips and activities for families who have children with SEND. Some parent carers are unable to travel due to their children's needs therefore our organized coach trips were very well received by the parent carer community. It also helped them to meet other people in similar circumstances, feel less

isolated and receive some peer-to-peer support.

'We don't get to leave Peterborough on our own This coach trip has been fantastic for the children.'

'Challenging to organize trips with our child with special needs this made it possible'

'They have been a helping hand when I struggled to get the help I needed I was pointed in the right direction by them'

'I don't drive outside of Peterborough on my own my 5 yr old got see the see the sea for the first time I feel safer travelling in an organized group coach trip'
