- Increase social anxiety as a result of the periods of lock down still a fear of going out
- What happens beyond 18 for those with SEND

Cost of living concerns are also about personal hygiene, securing food for restricted diets, inability to access social activities, health based activities – how will family outings be impacted.

Been struggling with electric as lot of. Money goes on that and hospital appointments paying for taxi so my daughter can attend her appointment

Struggling financially with the cost of things going up. Also have had to pay a big sum off a bill

We are not frivolous family. Any more cost rises and we will be going into debt.

Not being able to work due to caring but having carers allowance deducted from Universal credit.

Our youngest son is 17 now and has Autism He is getting on quite well at school but we do find he is not good at processing his emotions and when frustrate he sometimes does hit his mum WE would like some ideas on how to manage his emotion and how to keep him busy this summer when schools are out
